The citizen was sent to find an extension cord for the meeting when he stumbled upon the voting equipment. It shows how securely one precinct polling place stores its voting tabulators between elections. They were stored in an open area in the building.

Sometimes a picture is worth a thousand words. Does this seem secure to you?





We are told over and over we have one of the cleanest election systems in the country. When you scratch the surface of those claims, **DO THEY HOLD UP?** Note the dust on one of the tabulators.

We have no way of knowing whether this is the way the other, all-important, “sacred and proprietary” black box election equipment is secured across the state or if this is an anomaly. We just know it is the way it is done here.
