

# HOW TO BECOME AN ELECTION JUDGE

## SUBMIT AN APPLICATION FORM

- ▶ Contact the auditor or election official in the county in which you wish to apply and request an application.
- ▶ You may apply to be an election judge in **any** county in MN, not just the county where you reside.
- ▶ Election Judges are paid positions, and you are eligible for time off from your employer.
- ▶ Training will be required, either in-person or on-line.
- ▶ You must reapply every 2 years (even numbered years).
- ▶ Some precincts may offer shifts vs working an entire day.

## MAJOR PARTY & MN SECRETARY OF STATE LISTS

- ▶ [MN Statute 204B.21](#) requires that major political parties shall submit a list of potential Election Judge names to the MN Secretary Of State (SOS) by May 1st. On May 15th the SOS forwards the lists of names to County Auditors/Election Officials for hiring priority. To submit your name to your party, please go to:
